Community Watch (Chuck Stricklin, 864.350.8449, usercstric@charter.net) In our community, there is no substitute for caring neighbors looking out for each other. Our Watch Team of neighborhood volunteers are there to help look out for suspicious and emergency incidents in Acadia, but also to help look out for each other. The County Sheriff's Crime Prevention Unit at 864.422.2037 recommends everyone habitually lock their house and cars and keep your garage doors closed. There are two types of incidents that we, as Acadians, should always respond to: **Emergency situations** and non-emergency situations. An emergency situation is one where there is a possible immediate threat, like someone breaking into your car. Always call 911 first. Next, call your Captain Chuck Stricklin. Alerting your Watch Captain is important, to track these incidents. A non-emergency situation is when there is no immediate threat, like a suspicious person or vehicle, unusual behavior, or reporting a stolen item from your garage or yard, or asking the Sheriff to give a wellness check for you or a neighbor. Please call 864.271.5210 (Sheriff's office number for non-emergency **incidents).** Always ask the Sheriff's office for the *Incident Report number*. Next, contact your Watch Captain with the Incident Report number.
